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Challenges

- Limited budget allocation for asset replacement, servicing and parts.
- Procurement process itself is lengthy and challenging.
- Human Resource currently no biomedical team. Service is being temporarily covered by locums.
- Supply Chain issues limited supplier network. No purchasing power. Delivery timelines (limited space availability on freight forwarders).
- Increase in supplier costs, post COVID
- Shifts in demand for care

Opportunities & Development
