# RACS Global Health Strategy 2022 - 2027

- Consolidate and concentrate Global Health programs (Indo-Pacific)
- Enable greater advocacy and impact across networks and partnerships.
- Diversify and expand sustained funding sources (DFAT/MFAT/USAID)
- Leverage RACS reputation and capability
- Professionalise governance and compliance structures organisationally



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## **Specialised Clinical Services**

- **17 RACS Visiting Surgical** Teams deployed across 10 countries between Feb October 2023
- 2 surgical teams to be deployed in November 2023
- 1000 patients received a surgical consultation
- **377 patients** with improved access to quality surgical services
- **Specialties**: Paediatrics, ENT, Urology, Obstetrics and Gynaecology and Vascular surgery
- **Mentoring**: Ongoing mentoring of Pacific colleagues by clinical volunteers post visits
- 78 clinical volunteers deployed including 26 nurses



## **Clinical Capacity Development**

- 18 training teams, comprising 121 local and international instructors, conducted clinical training in 4 countries.
- 288 Indo-Pacific clinicians trained, including 77 nurses
- 7 Pacific nurses enrolled in a Post Graduate Certificate in Perioperative Nursing and being provided weekly mentoring

Training courses included:

- Surgical Simulation Training in Fiji and Samoa (in partnership with Monash Children's Simulation Centre)
- Care of the Critically Ill Surgical Patient (CCrISP)
- Emergency Management of Severe Trauma (EMST)
- Advanced Paediatric Life Support (APLS)
- Paediatric Life Support (PLS)
- Generic Instructor Training (GIC)
- Endoscopy Training (in partnership with FNU and ANZGITA)

## **Operational Challenges**

- Increased costs airfares, accommodation, freight, medical equipment and consumables
- Supply chain difficulty procuring some consumables that are in short supply and hospitals prioritised
- Logistics delays in customs clearance resulting in equipment not being available to the RACS team to start surgery
- Industrial action patients not able to access surgery due to striking clinical staff
- The unexpected 500 lb bomb discovered in Nauru one week before the RACS team arrived.
- Delayed surgical trips when surgical specialties change or countries are slow to communicate their clinical priorities
- Communication and coordination surgical teams from other countries have visited ahead of the RACS team so a very small patient list for the RACS team
