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
CERVICAL CANCER

- 4th most common form of cancer among women worldwide
- Human Papilloma Virus aetiology
- Preventable
- Global call for action to eliminate cervical cancer in 2018
- Global strategy for cervical cancer elimination in 2020

Cervical Cancer Global Estimates

PICT ESTIMATES OF > 26.0 HAS NOT CHANGED


CERVICAL CANCER IN THE PACIFIC

- 2nd most common cancer causing death in women in the region.
- 7.7-9% of women in the reproductive age group are estimated to live with cervical cancer
- DALY for women living with cervical cancer in the Pacific is amongst the highest globally
- Estimated case fatality ratio of 0.7 (70% death rate)
- Cervical cancer mortality in PICTs is estimated to be 9 times the mortality rate in Australasia

HIGH CERVICAL CANCER MORBIDITY AND MORTALITY IN PICT

REASONS:

- Poor access to public health system
- Weak cervical screening program
- Late presentation



- Inadequate clinical management
- No HPV Vaccination

Cervical Cancer Elimination; WHO global strategy and Target

Global Strategy

All countries to implement cervical cancer elimination program and meet the 90-70-90 target by 2030

Global target

- Vaccination: 90% of girls fully vaccinated with HPV vaccine by the age of 15
- Screening: 70% of women screened using high precision HPV molecular test by the age of 35 and again by the age of 45.
- Treatment: 90% of women with precancer treated and 90% of women with invasive cancer managed



CERVICAL CANCER IN THE PACIFIC

Cervical Cancer (29.1.2016 PIF Paper)

• In response to the Forum Leaders' decision on cervical cancer, the Pacific Community, which is mandated to work on regional health issues, is coordinating a study on the feasibility of carrying out a regional programme to address cervical cancer. This study will weigh the benefits of resourcing and conducting a regional program addressing cervical cancer, in light of the current prioritisation of addressing non-communicable diseases across the region. With guidance from the CROP Health & Population Working Group, the study will be conducted in the first half of 2016. Key recommendations will then be presented to Forum Leaders in 2016.

- HPV GeneXpert molecular tests
- HPV Screen & Treat in collaboration with Kirby Institute/Daffodil Centre and ACPCC

Cervical cancer HPV Screen & Treat in PICT

 SPC/Kirby assistant for Tonga will start soon, followed by Kiribati and Fiji

Multi-partner collaboration to be able to reach more countries

Recommendations to HOH and Government

- Countries Proactive approach to Cervical cancer Elimination

- All countries to implement Cervical Cancer Elimination Program by 2030.

- HOH support to the program.

Recommendation to Development Partners

PICTs can-not do it alone

- Continuous support from Development partners is required
- Collaborative effort between partners and PICT is needed to ensure PICTs reach Global Target by 2030.
